The Global Christianity Programme builds on the long engagement with World Mission through the Selly Oak Colleges. This is an exciting opportunity for pastors and leaders around the world to study together as part of a diverse community that includes those preparing for ministry within the British Churches. Transformative encounters and creative learning are at the centre of what we do together, as people are shaped and re-shaped for mission and ministry in a Global Church.

The Queen's Foundation equips the Church's current and future leaders. Informed by our commitment to theology which is both contextual and prophetic, we prepare individuals for ministry in a multi-faith and globalised world. Programme Options

The Programme offers a number of options for study and reflection on practice:

MA (Theology and Transformative Practice) is a one-year (12 month) full time course based at Queen's.

PhD (split location; part-time) offers the opportunity for further in depth research whilst mainly based in your home context.

Global Fellows Scheme invites skilled and experienced Church leaders and theologians to join our community for a short period to pursue research and offer input into our programmes.

Exchange visits allow seminarians from partner institutions to experience ministerial formation in a British context.

Short Courses are designed with partner Churches and groups to develop ministerial practice and theological reflection.
